Քրիստոս՝ Մեր Կեանքն ու Յարութիւնը

«Ինչո՞ւ ողջը մեռելներուն մէջ կը փնտռէք» (Ղկ 24.5)։

Յաւիտենական Ապրողին՝ մեր Փրկչին ու Աստուծոյ Յիսուս Քրիստոսի յարութեան առաւօտուն, ի՛ր իսկ պատգամաբերը կը վկայէ ու կը հաստատէ թէ մեռեալ կարծուածը ողջ է, յաւիտենապէս ողջ, եւ պէտք չէ զայն փնտռել մեռելներուն մէջ։ Յաւիտենական Ապրողն է, որ հրաշալի առաւօտ մը, մարդկութեան առջեւ կը բանայ յաւիտենականութեան ձամբան, մանաւանդ բոլոր անոնց համար, որոնք ձշմարիտ հաւատքով, անձնուրաց կեանքով եւ բարերար գործերով կը դառնան ծառան Քրիստոսի, անոր՝ որ նոյնն է միշտ –երէկ, այսօր եւ յաւիտեան (Եբր 13.8)։

Քրիստոնէական մեր հաւատքին խարիսխը Քրիստոսի յարութիւնն է։ Քրիստոսի ամբողջ առաքելութիւնը մարդկութեան փրկութեան համար, իր մարդեղութենէն սկսեալ մինչեւ խաչելութիւն ու մահ, իմաստ կը ստանայ եւ պատգամ կը դառնայ իր յարութեամբ, առանց որուն կը քանդուին քրիստոնէական մեր հաւատալիքներուն հիմերը։ Պօղոս Առաքեալի բառերով՝ «Ի զուր է մեր քարոզութիւնը» (Ա. Կր 15.14)։

Քրիստոսի քարոզութիւնը եւ փրկագործական զոհագործումը ձանչցող ու ընդունող, եւ իրենց անձերն ու կեանքը Փրկիչին հետ նոյնացնողներուն առաջիններէն եղանք նաեւ մենք՝ Հայ Ժողովուրդը, որ Քրիստոսի լարուցեալ կեանքին օրինակով պատձէնահանեց իր կեանքն ու ազգային անմահութիւնը։ Մեզի համար կեանքը Քրիստոս ինքն էր (Փիլ 1.21) եւ անոր համար զոհողութիւնը, մահն ու նահատակութիւնը այդ կեանքը շահիլ եղաւ։ Գոյատեւումի յոյսը՝ միախառնուած քրիստոնէական անխախտ հաւատքին, ներշնչեց մեզ՝ որոնելու միջոցներ, որոնք անձին փրկութեան աորնթեր՝ ապահովեցին ազգային գոլատեւումն ու յաւիտենականութիւնը։ Քրիստոնէական արժէքներով իմաստաւորեցինք մեր պայքարը, շատ լաւ գիտնալով որ Քրիստոսի լարութիւնը մեր կեանքին լաւիտենական ձառագալթող լոլսը պիտի րլլար, որ կարելի չէ գերեզմանել։ Գերեզմանր պարզապէս եղաւ կանգառ մր՝ շարունակելու համար մեր երթը դէպի լարուցեալ կեանք։ Ալլապէս, ինչպէ՞ս բացատրել ու հասկնալ նահատակութիւնը։ Անձի մր ամբողջական րնծայումը Քրիստոսի հաւատքին ու ձշմարտութեան՝ օրերու եւ տարիներու գումար եղող կեանքէն շա՛տ վեր է, մարդկային իմաստութիւնը անդրանցնող։ Յաւիտենականութեան հաւատքին նկատմամբ կասկած ունեցող անձերու համար, անիկա թերեւս անհեթեթութիւն նկատուի, եւ Քրիստոսի խաչն ու լարութիւնը լիմարութիւն թուի (Ա. Կր 2. 20-25), բայց հաւատացողներուս համար անիկա Աստուծոլ

զօրութիւնն ու իմաստութիւնն է, որուն դիմաց կոտնակոխուի մահը, եւ ազգային նահատակութեամբ կը պայծառակերպուի յաւիտենական կեանքը։ Քրիստոսի խաչը մեր ուսերէն վար չեկաւ, խաչուեցանք, խաչուեցանք բազմիցս խաչուեցանք, բայց Քրիստոսի նման յարութիւն առինք, քանի մեր իմաստութիւնը աշխարհի իմաստութիւնը չեղաւ, այլ քրիստոնէական հաւատքի իմաստութիւնը, որ չի թողուր ողջերը մեռելներուն մէջ փնտռել։

Այս Ճշմարտութեան լաւագոյն վկայութիւնը մեր ազգի կեանքին մէջ երկու թուականներ են՝ 1915 եւ 1918։ Առաջինը խաչելութիւնն է, երկրորդը՝ յարութիւնը։ Ցեղասպանութեան աղէտը այնքա՛ն դառն ու սպառնալից էր, որ պապենական մեր հողերուն, պատմական Հայաստանի կորուստին հետ, շատեր այն համոզումը ունեցան, որ որպէս ժողովուրդ՝ ֆիզիքական մեր գոյութեանն ալ վերջ կը գտնէր։ Սակայն խաչելութենէն ետք յարութեան հաւատքն ու յոյսը «լինելու» մեր կամքը կոփեցին, եւ Մայիսեան պայծառ առաւօտը, «վարդահեղեղ արշալոյսը», Հայոց պատմութեան էջերուն վրայ եկաւ վկան հանդիսանալու ազգային մեր յարութեան։ Հայ ժողովուրդը հաստատակամ յայտարարեց, թէ ինչո՞ւ ողջը մեռելներուն մէջ կը փնտռէք։

Մայիսեան յարութեան եւ յաղթանակին 100-ամեակին առիթով, երբ կը մտածենք մոխիրներէն վերյառնելու եւ նոր կեանք ունենալու մեր կամքին մասին, բնականաբար մեր Հայրենիքի յառաջդիմութիւնը, հզօրացումն ու անվտանգութիւնը պէտք է դառնայ իւրաքանչիւր հայու մտահոգութիւնը։ Ներելի չէ կրաւորական ոեւէ կեցուածք։ Հայրենիքը սրբազան հող է ու պատմութիւն։ Անկախութիւնը կերտելը պայքար է ու նահատակութիւն, անկախութիւն պահելը՝ ամբողջական զոհողութիւն, որ զգացում չէ, այլ կատարեալ նուիրաբերում ու մասնակցութիւն։

Ապրեցանք ոչ թէ մեռնելու համար, այլ գիտցանք մեռնիլ՝ ապրելու համար, ինչպէս Երջանկայիշատակ Խորէն Ա. Վեհափառ Հայրապետը կը կրկնէր՝ խոր համոզումով։

Մեր Փրկչին Սուրբ Յարութեան տօնին առիթով, եկէք մեր հաւատքը դարձեալ կենսաւորենք, քրիստոնէական մեր նկարագիրը անաղարտ պահենք, եւ ներշնչուած ու գօտեպնդուած անկախ Հայաստանով՝ շարունակենք մեր պայքարը անաւարտ մնացած մեր տեսիլքներուն ամբողջական իրականացումին համար։

PRELATE EASTER MESSAGE



CHRIST—OUR LIFE AND RESURRECTION

"Why do you look for the living among the dead?" (Luke 24:5)

For the One who lives forever, on the morning of the Resurrection of our Savior and God Jesus Christ, it was His own messenger who testifies and confirms that the One believed to be dead is alive—

eternally alive—and should not be sought amongst the dead. On that miraculous morning He who lives forever opened the road to eternity for humanity, especially for all those who with true faith, self-denial, and good deeds become servants of Christ—the One who is always the same—yesterday, and today, and forever. (Hebrews 13:8)

The anchor of our Christian faith is Christ's Resurrection. Christ's entire mission for the salvation of humanity beginning with His Incarnation to His crucifixion and death, receives meaning and becomes a message with His Resurrection. Without this, the foundation of our Christian belief collapses. In the words of Paul the Apostle, "Our preaching is in vain." (1 Cor. 15:14)

We, the Armenian people, were among the first to recognize and accept Christ's preaching and salvific sacrifice, and to replicate ourselves and our lives akin to Christ. By the example of Christ's resurrected life, we modeled our lives and our nation's immortality on the example of Christ's resurrected life. For us "living is Christ" (Phil. 1:21), and sacrifice, death, and martyrdom for Him is gaining that life. The hope of survival mixed with the immovable Christian faith inspired us to seek ways that along with our individual salvation, would secure our nation's survival and immortality. We gained that life by sacrifice, death, and martyrdom for Him. With Christian values we gave meaning to our struggle knowing very well that Christ's Resurrection was to be our life's eternal shining light that cannot be buried. The cemetery plainly became a pause before we continued our journey toward a resurrected life. Otherwise how can we explain and understand martyrdom? A person's total dedication to Christ's faith and truth is much more than the sum total of days and years that transcends the wisdom of humanity. For those who doubt the faith of eternity, perhaps even consider it to be absurd, think that Christ's

cross and resurrection are foolishness (1 Cor. 2:20-25). But for those of us who are believers, this is God's power and wisdom that tramples death, and with a nation's martyrdom we celebrate eternal life. Christ's cross did not come down our shoulders. We were crucified... crucified many times, but like Christ we were resurrected, because our wisdom was not temporal wisdom, but rather the wisdom of our Christian faith that does not allow seeking the living amongst the dead.

The best testimony of this in the life of our nation is two dates: 1915 and 1918. The first was crucifixion; the second was resurrection. The catastrophe of the Genocide was so harsh and menacing that together with the loss of our ancestral land and historic Armenia, many believed that this was the end of our physical existence. However, after crucifixion the faith and hope of resurrection was forged on our will "to be" when on a bright May morning of a "rose-colored dawn" we were the witnesses of the resurrection of our nation for the pages of Armenian history. The Armenian people resolutely proclaimed, Why do you look for the living among the dead?

On the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the resurrection and victory of May, when we contemplate our resurrection from the ashes, and the establishment of new life on our will, without doubt we see that the progress, strengthening, and safety of our Fatherland must become the concern of every Armenian. Any kind of passivity is unforgiveable. The Fatherland is sacred soil and history. Building independence entails struggle and martyrdom. Maintaining independence entails total sacrifice, not just as an emotion, but with perfect dedication and participation.

We lived not to die, but rather we knew death in order to live," as His Holiness Catholicos Khoren I, of blessed memory, would often repeat with deep conviction.

On the occasion of the Resurrection of our Savior, let us again vivify our faith, keep our Christian image pure, and inspired and girded by independent Armenia together continue our struggle to fulfill our uncompleted vision.

A blessed Holy Resurrection. Christ is risen from the dead.

Congratulations on the 100th anniversary of the first Republic of Armenia.

TRUSTEE CORNER

HONORING HIS EMINENCE



Having received word that His Eminence Abp. Oshagan would not be seeking reelection as the Prelate of the Armenian Apostolic Church of the Eastern United States, Der Hayr and the Board of Trustees decided to honor His Eminence with a small, family-style gathering of Trustees, NRA Delegates, Executives and Directors of our affiliated church bodies and our three schools at the Armenian American Social Club in Watertown.

The evening was all the more meaningful because His Eminence was celebrating the 50th Anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood and 20 years as Prelate. Mr. Raffi Manjikian, Chairman of the Board of Trustees presented a number of gifts to His Eminence as a token of our appreciation for Surpazan's support. The gifts included two groves of trees to be planted in



Armenia in Surpazan's name; two framed historic pictures, and a New England Patriots Jersey with Surpazan's name and the number 20 emblazoned on the back., signifying the number of years he was our Prelate. Der Hayr then shared some of his thoughts and feelings about his relationship with Oshagan Surpazan going back to the early 1970's when Der Hayr was a seminarian in Antelias.

Surpazan then offered his heartfelt thanks for the gifts and extolled the St. Stephen's Church community for its dedication and hard work as one of the premiere parishes of the Prelacy.

He said that during his twenty years as Prelate, his number one priority was serving his people to the best of his ability.

His Eminence also said that he would now be focusing on completing two very important project which he has been working on for many, many years. First and foremost is the publication of a new modern and easily understandable version of the Old Testament in Standard Western Armenian. This work which is more than half finishes, will be the companion volume of the New Testament which was published some time ago.

His other pet project also began many years ago, namely to preserve the sacred hymns of the Armenian church by transcribing them into modern western musical notation. He has already completed several volumes of music, and is happy to have the time to finish the series.

The wonderful evening ended with Abp. Oshagan's benediction.

CELEBRATING SIXTY YEARS

RECEPTION AND SACRED HYMNS CONCERT

2017 marked the Sixtieth Anniversary of St. Stephen's consecration, which had taken place on October 20, 1957. On this occasion, the Pastor and Board of Trustees deemed it most fitting to observe this anniversary in a special and unique way. The celebration was originally planned for the third week in October, 2017, but had to be postponed due to scheduling conflicts. It was decided to reschedule the celebration to Saturday, January 19, 2018. The evening began with a Gala reception in the church hall under the auspices of His Eminence Archbishop Oshagan Choloyan, Prelate of the Armenian Apostolic Church of the Eastern United States. The hall had been miraculously transformed into a lovely venue for dining, drinking and mingling with friends and fellow church members. The stage had been made over into an historical exhibition of pictures, videos and other memorabilia. a special booklet was prepared for the occasion and a scrumptious feast prepared for the attendees.

Then it was time to go upstairs to be treated to a unique concert of spiritual music sung by renowned Armenian vocalist, Onnig Dinkjian, who is also an ordained deacon in the Armenian Church. Opening remarks and introduction were done by Rev. Archpriest Antranig Baljian, following which, Onnig performed a moving and very spiritually uplifting rendition of Sharagans, drawn primarily from the Divine Liturgy of the Armenian Apostolic Church. These sacred hymns were sung with a deep sense of faith and deep spirituality by a deeply humble, God-fearing man known more as a singer of Armenian folk and popular songs. Few people know that for many years Onnig has served as an Archdeacon in the Armenian Church, of which he continues to be a loyal and faith-filled servant. Onnig was accompanied on the organ by his son, Ara Dinkjian, also a renowned popular musician.

After the concert, His Eminence praised the quality of the concert, congratulated the community on the occasion of the church's 60th Anniversary and extolled the active role St. Stephen's has played in the life of the Armenian community in America and in the establishment and growth of the Prelacy. The concert ended with His Eminence's benediction, after which all of the participants retired downstairs once again for dessert and coffee.

BLESSING OF NEW ORGAN

As reported in the last issue of the JRAK, a brand new Allen Organ was purchased and installed since our organ was 45 years old with significant loss of functionality beyond repair. Along with the organ, additional improvements were made modernize the audio system for improved acoustics and dependability both for the choir and participants of the *Badarak* as well as the organ.

On Sunday, January 21, 2018 the new organ was blessed by His Eminence during the Divine Liturgy, using a special blessing he had created for this occasion. Up until the time of the blessing, the choir sang the hymns of the *Badarak* a capella, The first hymn sung with the accompaniment of the newly blessed organ, appropriately, was the Lord's Prayer. His Eminence also blessed special choir pins to be distributed to the members of the church choir.

Following the service upstairs, a reception was held downstairs with a brief program, during which our choir mistress, Mrs. Karen Demirjian, and organist, Mrs. Mary Ann Kazanjian were presented by His Eminence with Prelacy Certificates of Merit. Mrs. Demirjian was cited for her service in the choir spanning more than 50 years as a singer, assistant organist and Choirmistress. Mrs. Kazanjian was honored for playing the organ in the Armenian Church for 50+ years, twenty of which were as organist of St. Stephen's.











CELEBRATING SIXTY YEARS -- RENEWAL INITIATIVES

CHURCH RENOVATION PROJECT

2017 was proclaimed the year of renewal by His Holiness Aram I, Catholicos of the Great House of Cilicia. It was also the 60th Anniversary of the Consecration of St. Stephen's. Consequently, Der Hayr and the Board of Trustees decided to initiate several projects and new programs. While His Holiness' message was geared toward spiritual renewal, it was obvious that the physical plant must had to be taken care of so that the spiritual life of the church could continue to thrive. A Capital Fund was established for the purpose of raising the requisite amounts of money for this project in addition to monies put aside from bequests made to the church. Proudly, the Church Renewal Project was completed by Palm Sunday, March 25, 2018, in time for the Prelate's annual visitation to our parish.

The list of major renovations undertaken include:

- NEW ORGAN PURCHASE. As reported in the last issue of JRAK, the need for a new organ was compelling. Funding for this project began before the establishment of the general fund, with several generous donations and pledges. An upgrade to the sound system was also performed.
- PEW REUPHOLSTERING. Considering the deteriorating state of our church pews after twenty years of use and, in many places exposure to sunlight, it was decided to make that one of the priorities. The pews were totally reupholstered with high-grade material. They not only look beautiful, but, due to extra thick padding, are ultra comfortable.
- CHURCH PAINTING: The whole of the church interior as well as the hallway leading downstairs and the basement foyer were all repainted. The church looks absolutely gorgeous! New panels for the Organ speakers were crafted, painted and installed as well. They are tableaux which depict the tree of life [Armenian: Ծառ օր Φայտ Կենաց (Dzar or Payd Genats)] which is a very common theme in Armenian hymnology and religious writings representing both the tree in Eden as well as the Cross of Christ.
- FRONT STAIR REPAIR: Again as reported in the last issue of the JRAK the church's front stairway was recaulked and several areas of crumbling sidewalk repaired.
- REPAINTING OF THE WROUGHT IRON PERIMETER FENCE.

There are some projects which are in the process of being accomplished, and are dependent on warmer weather. This includes recaulking around the stained glass windows as well as repairing broken panes; some ongoing roof work/gutter work on the church and the Parish House, and a needs assessment of the church heating system.

The Capital fund drive is continuing through 2018 and anyone who wishes may make a donation to help in completing the upgrade to our physical plant. All donations to this herculean but worthwhile endeavor will be published in the final issue (September-January) of the JRAK.

Deepest thanks to those who have already donated. Pictures on the following pages will allow you to see scope and result of the work that was undertaken.

NEW PROGRAMS

Hand in hand with the physical upgrades, Der Hayr and the Board of Trustees, understanding the need for overall spiritual renewal within the parish, did the following:

- YOUTH OUTREACH. In consultation with the Prelacy's Director of Youth Ministry, it was decided to initiate a youth program that has been tested in pilot programs in three of our Prelacy parishes. Der Hayr and the Board reached out to the Armenian Youth Federation and the Homenetmen on the occasion of their 85th and 100th anniversaries respectively. On Sunday, January 14, (the actual date of the founding of the AYF in 1933) members of the organization were invited to church to hear Der Hayr's sermon prepared specifically for them and to take communion together. A similar Sunday encounter is being pursued for the Homenetmen scouts as well. In the meantime, Der Hayr invited twelve young scouts to have their feet washed on Maundy Thursday.
- BIBLE STUDY. At the request of our younger adult members, Der Hayr and the Board of Trustees decided to invite Sunday School Director Nayiri Baljian Bell to establish a regular, ongoing Bible Study program beginning in 2018. She was aided in this endeavor by Dn. Jirayr Barsoumian. This year's theme has been "The Heart of God in the Heart of Liturgy" focusing on the scriptures contained in the Holy *Badarak*. The study sessions are held on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at 7:00 P.M. in the church hall and have been enthusiastically received by the community.
- LENTEN LECTURE SERIES. Due to the ongoing renovation in the church proper during Lent and the inability to use the church during the week, Der Hayr decided to forego the traditional Lenten worship and invite a series of lecturers to speak on the theme "GOD IS...", with each speaker opting to finish the sentence with a message about what God means to them. Scheduled speakers were 1. Der Hayr; 2. Rev. Fr. Stephan Baljian pastor of St. Gregory's in North Andover; 3. Rev. Dr. Avedis Boynerian, Pastor of Armenian Memorial Church in Watertown; 4. Archdeacon Shant Kazanjian, Director of Religious Education for the Eastern Prelacy in New York; 5. Ms. Nayiri Baljian Bell, Director of St. Stephen's Sunday School, and 6. Rev. Archpriest Gomidas Baghsarian, Adjunct Professor of Theology at Providence College.
- COMMUNITY OUTREACH. Der Hayr and the Board of Trustees have approved an initiative proposed by Yeretzgin to form a visitation committee to reach out to home-bound parishioners who have difficulty in getting out to go to church on Sundays. You will be hearing more about this committee and its activities once it is up and running.

OBITUARY



MARY ROSE MOORADIAN: One of our faithful and well-loved Sunday School teachers entered peacefully into eternal rest in the presence of Der Hayr and surrounded by a circle of very close friends and colleagues on December 11, 2017. She was the beloved daughter of the late Rebecca (DerMesrobian) Mooradian, leaves behind her best friends Debbie Saryan, Vanessa Ovian and Lauren Balekian and her adored canine companions Sevan and Anoush, as well as godchildren, cousins and many dear friends.

Mary attended Presentation of Mary Academy in Methuen for high school, graduating in 1968. She then went on to Boston University graduating in 1973 with a BA degree in Russian literature. She continued her education completing her graduate studies in Slavic languages and literature at the University of Toronto with a Masters degree conferred upon her in 1975.

As a youngster she joined the Armenian Youth Federation, served on the Federation's Central Executive and established one of the most successful programs for Armenian youth in America, the annual National Junior Seminar, for which she received special recognition in October of 2008. She was also responsible for the establishment of the combined Jr./Sr. chapter of the AYF in North Andover.

Mary also remained an active member of the Armenian Relief Society and was a lifelong member of her local "Arax" Chapter. For several years, she was in charge of the ARS Summer Studies Program for young college students.

Since 2005, Mary has demonstrated her commitment and dedicated Christian service to the youth here at St. Stephen's as the sixth grade Sunday School teacher. "Miss Mary" was truly loved by all her students without exception and showed not only that she was a talented teacher and committed Christian woman, but also that she was an innovative and creative educator.

She established the iconic annual Bible Foods Coffee Hour, with the students offering foods which are mentioned in the Bible. This has become an important and ongoing part of our Sunday School's yearly activities.

Mary also organized a project whereby the students in her class and eventually the whole Sunday School, conducted research to determine which church each student's ancestors worshipped at in the old country.

Finally the "Silk Road Project" established a link between Mary's students and their past by pulling together handmade needlelace and other crafts associated with the various villages their ancestors were from. This blossomed into a full-blown, professionally prepared exhibit entitled "Heartstrings: Embracing Armenian Needlelace, Embroidery and Rugs" using materials collected by her from Sunday School students and others. The collection was exhibited at the Lynn Museum on the occasion of the 102nd Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide.

JANET (TEVEKELIAN)
JEGHELIAN: of Walpole, formerly of Westwood entered into eternal rest on February 3, 2018. She was the beloved wife of the late Haig Jeghelian and devoted mother of Armen and Tina Jeghelian and the late Robin Theriault; loving grandmother of Emily; sister of Claire Kushigian and her husband Harry, and Loving aunt of Armine Kanis and Nairi Koroghlian.

She graduated from Newton High School and from Boston University's Sargent School for



Physical Therapy. She furthered her training at the New York University Bellevue Medical Facility where she treated an impressive list of patients including Roy Campanella, the famous baseball player. She returned to the Boston area and continued her career as a Physical Therapist and in fact was the personal therapist for Joseph Kennedy, the President's father, at the Kennedy compound in Hyannis.

A passion for politics began in 1972 when she was the first female elected as a Westwood Selectman.

Her intelligence, quick wit and drive for current events eventually led to another career as a well known radio talk show host for WRKO and WBZ. She was then sought after as a spokesperson for various fundraisers and charitable events.

Her broadcasting successes led her back to the political arena when Janet ran as a candidate for the US Senate and also for the Massachusetts Lieutenant Governor's position.

Before retirement her most recent position was the Director of Rehabilitation at the Stone Institute. During this time, Janet was given the Downtown Boston Business & Professional Women's Club - Woman of Achievement Award - for her exceptional qualities of leadership and integrity and her distinguished achievements for the betterment of her community.

Janet's community involvement was quite extensive. She was a Trustee of St. Stephen's church and a member of their Ladies Guild and Church choir. She also sang in the Yerevan Choral Group, and served as Board President for the Armenian Women's Welfare Association as well as a past Trustee for Boston University.

From a young age, Janet enjoyed participating in the AYF Armenian Olympics. and earned the Boston Siamanto chapter a total of 35 points in the baseball throw and high jump events. She loved watching the Patriots, the Boston Bruins, the Celtics, and always enjoyed playing tennis especially with her sister, Claire Kushigian. Her most cherished moments were spent entertaining with family and close friends.

Our deepest sympathies to the families of these two devoted, faithful and committed women. Their loss is felt by our whole community. May the Lord rest their souls and Illuminate them in heavenly light. Amen.


The Mother Armenia statue symbolizes peace through strength. Its location on a hill overlooking Yerevan makes it look like a guardian of the Armenian capital.

THEOPHANY, HOLY WEEK, PALM SUNDAY AND EASTER

Theophany, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter services were particularly meaningful this year. On January 6, 2018 the Godfather of the Cross during the service commemorating Jesus's baptism in the Jordan River was young Mark Guzelian, son of Mr. Andrew and Dr. Alice Zacarian Guzelian. [1]

His Eminence Abp. Oshagan Choloyan, Prelate of the Armenian Apostolic Church of the Eastern United States celebrated Divine Liturgy according to our church's long standing tradition. But this year was different in that it was His Eminence's last official Palm Sunday Liturgy as Prelate, since he has decided not to run for reelection in order to devote his time to finishing two important projects he has been working on for many years: the translation of the Old Testament into easily understandable modern Standard Western Armenian and the transcription of the Armenian church Sharagans or liturgical hymns into western musical notation. Students from the lower grades of Sunday School participated in the morning procession. Following the Liturgy the solemn service of the Opening of the Portals (Trnpatsek) was performed during which, on the occasion of the 100th Anniversary of Armenian independence and the establishment of the Republic of Armenia, Mr. Joshua Tevekelian, Chairman of the local Gomideh of the Armenian Revolutionary Federation, was the curtain drawer. On Tuesday morning, Der Hayr was invited to wash the feet of twelve of the elderly residents of the Armenian Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Jamaica Plain, MA. Der Hayr later posted these comments: "I had the honor today of following Jesus' example and washing the feet of our elderly. It was truly a moving and humbling experience for me to wash the feet of those who labored and toiled so hard and long to give us all a better future. God bless them and all our seniors during this Holy Week and the holiest of seasons." [8]

Ten young girls from our Sunday School participated in Tuesday evening's Ten Maidens' service, recreating the parable found in Matt. 25:1-13. Under the direction of Mrs. Karen Aykanian Demirjian, Choirmistress and Mrs. Mary Ann Kazanjian, Organist, the girls sang all the *Sharagans* of the service and read the scriptures. [6-7]

On the occasion of the 100th Anniversary of Armenia's independence as well as that of the establishment of the H.M.E.M., Der Hayr invited twelve young Boy Scouts to have their feet washed on Thursday Evening. In his homily Der Hayr told the young scouts that they are the Armenian people's soldiers of today and that, as Jesus showed in the simple act of washing the feet of His disciples, they must serve their people and each other with respect and humility. This service was followed by the service of Tenebrae (i.e. darkness) or *Khavaroum.* [9-11]

On Good Friday, the Service of Crucifixion was performed at Noon, and in the evening, the Service of Entombment. [12] Saturday morning over two hundred of the students, parents and teachers of our Elementary, Saturday and Sunday schools participated in the annual student's communion-breakfast hosted by the Sunday School. [13-16] In the Evening, Easter Vigil Divine Liturgy (*Jrakalouytsi Badarak*) was celebrated by Archpriest Vazken Bekiarian, former Pastor of the Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Worcester [17] who currently is serving as a visiting pastor to several communities as needed. Der Vazken was also with us at Thursday night's service as well as on Easter Sunday to help with Confession and the distribution of Holy Communion. Following joyous Easter Sunday service, many of the faithful gathered downstairs for fellowship, choreg and cheese and cracking Easter Eggs. [18-21] Note: Numbers in brackets refer to photos.



Liturgical Participation

The program focused on the power of personal narrative and the concept of personal responsibility in carrying on community traditions. Teachers from St. Stephen's and St. James worked collaboratively to facilitate the program. It was a wonderful opportunity to partner with our neighbor church and we are looking forward to reciprocating soon!

Year End

It is easy to focus on programs and events and forget the bigger goal of the Sunday School, which is to provide a strong Christian educational foundation for our children. As we come to the end of the year, it is only natural to ask, when does Sunday School end? While our closing day will be May 20, it is important to remember that the process of Christian formation, of which Sunday School is only a small part, is ongoing. We as parents, grandparents, and the greater church community are responsible for bringing up our children in the faith, which means not only bringing them to Sunday School, but also bringing them to Badarak, praying with them at home, reading the Bible together with them, and performing acts of service. This is how we engage the heads, hands, and hearts of our children in a way that is truly Christian formative. It is always a challenge to incorporate new elements into our routine, especially when there are already so many things competing for our time. At the same time, our faith tells us that nothing is more important than to seek God first. The ongoing process of Christian formation continues into adulthood, but we need to teach our children to seek God now, otherwise, we can't necessarily expect them to seek God in the future.
